- Lack of current alumni engagement

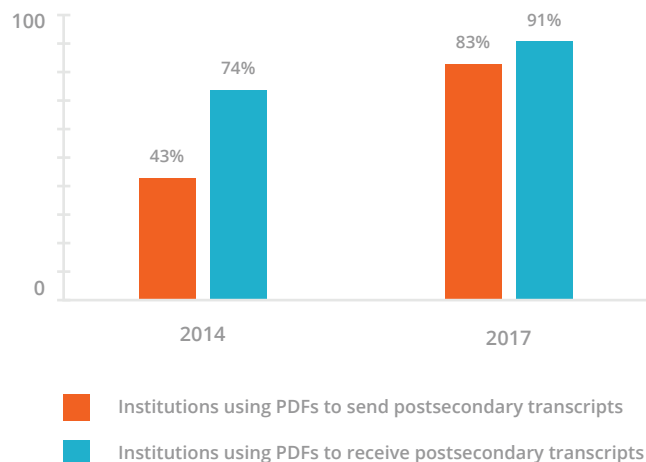

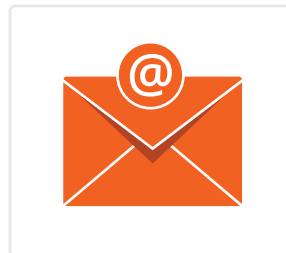
The Shifting Trend to Digital Credentials

The academic tide is turning toward digital academic credentials - rather rapidly, at that. A 2017 report from the American Association of Collegiate Registrars and Admissions Officers (AACRAO) compared recent digital credential use among academic institutions to that of 2014. According to the organization's findings:

- **83 percent** of institutions use PDFs to send postsecondary transcripts, up from 43 percent.
- **91 percent** of institutions use PDFs to receive postsecondary transcripts, up from 74 percent.



Will we continue to see such an increase in the next three years? It certainly seems so, according to the demand we saw during our first year offering digital diplomas and certificates.

Fulfilling expectations, promoting social sharing

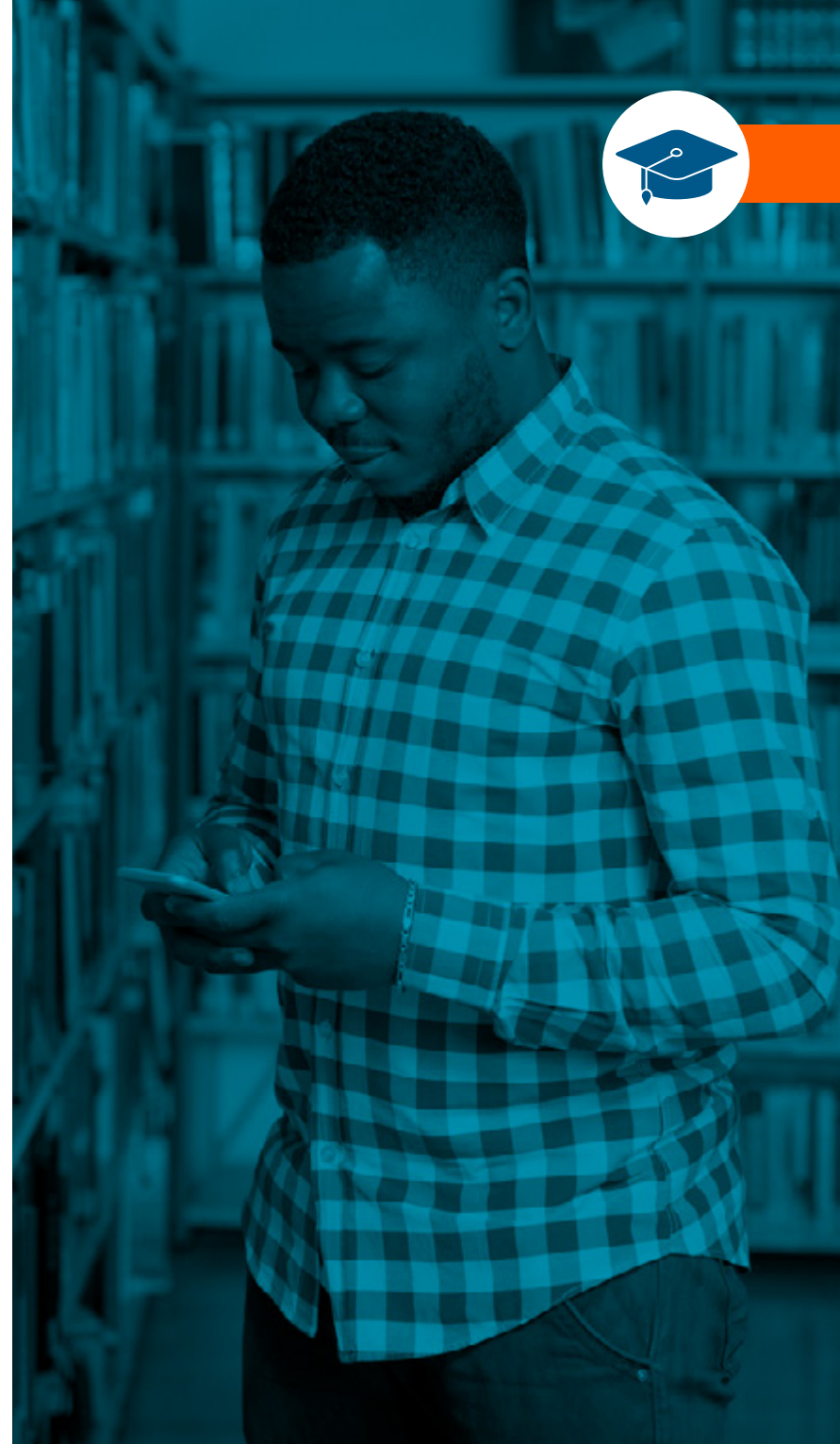

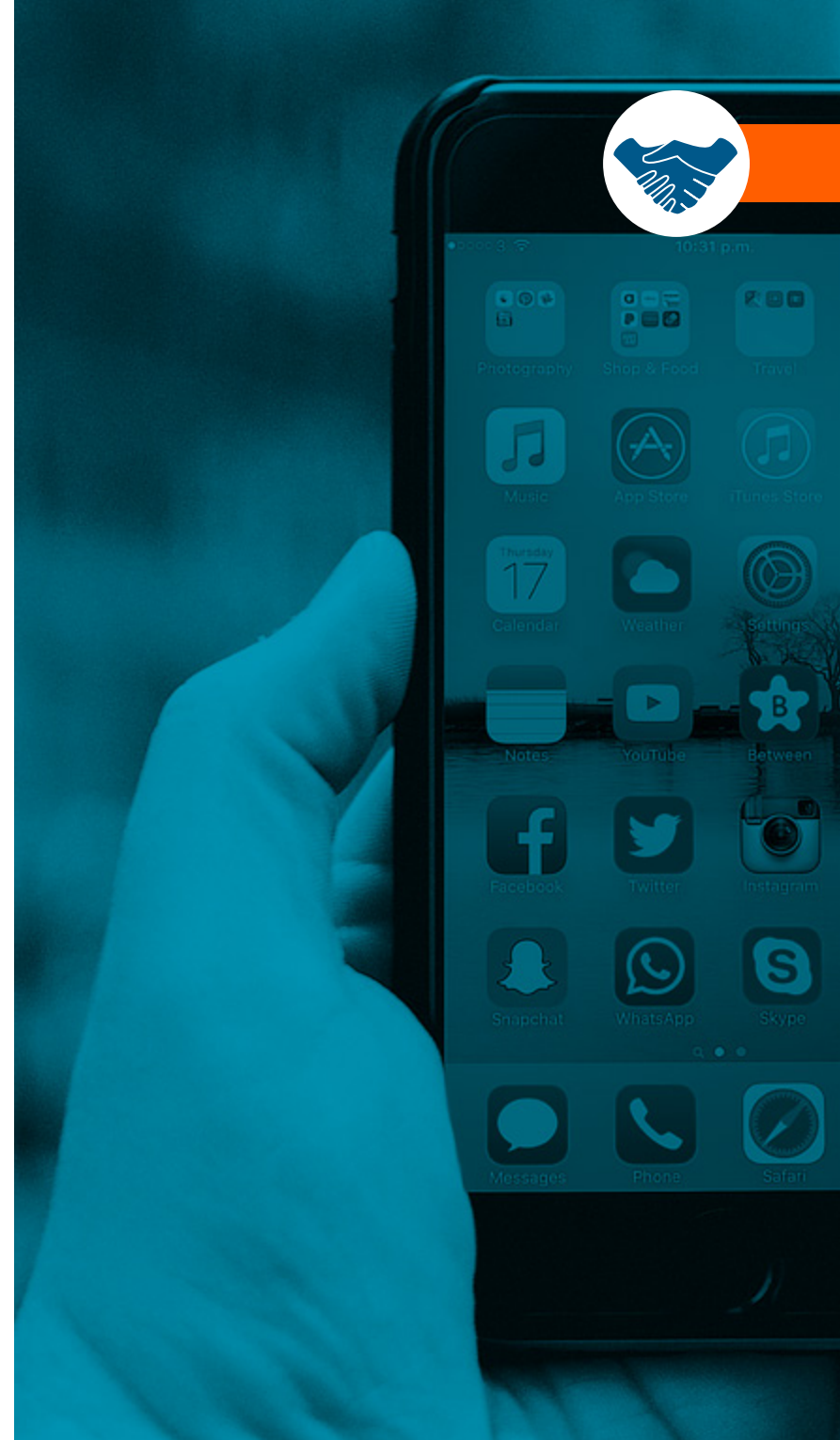
